the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company, entitled, 'A further supplement to the act of Assembly, of eighteen hundred and fifteen, chapter forty-eight, incorporating the Balmore and Harford Turnpike Company;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to refund to Stephen B. Gore, collector of taxes in Carroll county, a sum of money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of the State;"

A bill entitled, "An Act empowering Jacob Resh and Jabez Armacost to sell a lot of land which was deeded by Charles Bablitz, June fourteenth, eighteen hundred and four, to Peter Bablitz, Henry Kelbaugh, Christian Kelbaugh and Philip Myers, and recorded in the land records of Baltimore county, in liber W. G., No. 81, folio 562;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to authorize and empower the Commissioners of Baltimore and Harford counties to construct a bridge across the Little Gunpowder Falls between Jericho and Jerusalem Mills, and to levy a sum of money therefor;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to make valid the bond of the Register of Wills of Caroline county, Md.;"

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, "An Act to authorize Henry Cannon Charles, of Caroline county, who is under twenty-one years of age to receive from, and release Joshua Noble and Charles Wright, Administrators of his father Cannon Charles, the distributive share due to him from the estate of his said father, and also contract for, and purchase a farm and carry on the same as fully as if he were of lawful age;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to repeal the forty-first and forty-second sections of article fifty-one, Code of Public General Laws, relating to justices of the peace, and to re-enact the same with amendments;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to repeal the 5th section of the 28th chapter of the acts of the Extra Session of General Assembly of 1861, entitled, 'An Act to amend the 65th section of the Code of Public Local Laws of Somerset counsy, relating to justices of the peace and constables,' passed 10th June, 1861;"

Endorsed, "rejected."
