

MONDAY, March 7, 4½ o'clock, P. M.

The House met.

Present at the call of the roll the following members:

Messrs. Mr. McCoy, from the committee on Claims, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to authorize the Treasurer to pay to Joshua H. Hynes, former sheriff Baltimore county, a sum of money, erroneously paid into the Treasury;"

Which was read the first time.

Also, favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to authorize the Treasurer to pay on the warrant of the Comptroller, unto Ezekiel F. Chambers, the sum of \$500, for services rendered the State in two cases, in defence of the grain law, one in the city of Baltimore, the other before the Court of Appeals, by order of the Governor;"

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Barron, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill to regulate the fees of Justices of the Peace and Constables, in the city of Baltimore;"

Which was read the first time.

The Senate bill entitled, "An Act to repeal section 64, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Pleadings, Practice and Process, and to re-enact the same with amendments;"

Was read the third time; amended, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
