The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following Senate bills:

A bill entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Big Vein Coal Company:"

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, "An Act to repeal section 75, article 17, of the Public Local Laws entitled, 'Queen Anne's county,' and section 1, article 17, of the Supplement and re-enact the same with amendments;'

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Tolson, Pierce and Murray, of Worcester.

A bill entitled, "An Act to authorize the county commissioners of Queen Anne's county to levy a sum of money on the assessable property of said county, to keep in repair the roads or streets in the town of Centreville, and to give the commissioners of said town the control thereof;"

Which was read the third time and referred to Messrs. Pierce, Tolson and Smith.

A bill entitled, "An Act to compensate Edward W. Belt, State's Attorney for Prince George's county, for professional services rendered the State of Maryland, under an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, 1860, chapter 326;"

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Claims.

A bill entitled, "An Act to legalize the official acts of Robert K. Willson, a justice of the peace for Queen Anne's

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Also, returned the following House bills:

A bill entitled, "An Act to allow Seth W. Warfield, former sheriff and collector of taxes for Howard county, further time to complete his collections;"

Endorsed, "passed by year and nays with proposed amendment;"
