Mr. Frazier, from a select committee, reported a bill entitled, “An Act amendatory to an Act passed at December session, 1861 and 1862, chapter one hundred and sixty-eight, entitled, ‘An Act amendatory of an Act, passed January session, 1858,’ entitled, ‘An Act to lay off and establish a new election district in Dorchester county,’ to be called district number 12, or Williamsburg District;”

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Trail, from the committee on Militia, reported a bill entitled, “An Act to repeal ‘an Act passed at the April session of the General Assembly, 1861, chapter 79,’ which repealed the 41st, 42d, 43d, 46th, 47th, 48th and 112th sections of the 63d article of the Code of General Laws, entitled ‘Militia,’ and the 5th section of the 8th article of the same Laws, entitled, ‘Armories,’ and the 741st, 742d and 743d sections of the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled ‘City of Baltimore,’ and to re-enact the said sections so repealed;”
