The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The bill entitled, "A supplement to an act entitled, 'An Act to incorporate the Baltimore United Fire Department,' passed December session, 1833, chapter 187;"

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading;

Mr. Stockbridge submitted the following amendment:

"Provided, that said Department shall not in any year donate more than the nett income for that year of the investments of said corporation; and provided further, that all donations made by said corporation shall be regulated by rule or by-law adopted by said corporation, and no person or family shall be excluded from the benefit of such donation because that such person or the deceased head of such family is or at any time was a member of any other department or organization;"

Which was rejected.

The bill was then read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act creating Boards of Relief in each county of the State, and a central supervisory Board for the city of Baltimore and the State at large; and appropriating two millions of dollars, or as much thereof as may from time to time be needed, for the relief of the families of Maryland soldiers; also, levying a State tax of five cents on the hundred dollars on all the taxable property of the State, to meet the requirements of the act;"

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading;

Mr. Trail moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill:
