The bill entitled, "An Act empowering Thomas Watts, John M. Wheeler, and George Cullison, to sell the Cullison meeting house property, in the fifth election district of Baltimore county and use the proceeds for the erection of a church near Wheeler's school house;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to make valid the last will and testament of Sally M. Parsons, late wife of Jehu H. Parsons, of Somerset county, Maryland;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to incorporate the congregation of the Church of God at Uniontown, Carroll county;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Chesapeake and Potomac Canal Company;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to regulate the fee charged by constables for serving summons in civil suits and return in Allegany and Frederick counties;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to authorize and empower the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to collect and receive from the property holders on both sides of North Avenue as well in Baltimore county as in the city of Baltimore, the sums severally assessed to them for the grading of said avenue;"

The bill entitled, "An Act a supplement to an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Little Gunpowder Falls Turnpike Company, passed March the 2d, 1860, chapter 359;"

The bill entitled, "An Act to amend and re-enact section two of article thirty-three of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Deaf, Dumb and Blind, education of,' and relating to the amount to be paid for said education;"
