

various school districts of those counties where the law now so provides, from choosing district trustees and other local officers to manage the affairs of the schools therein, in the manner heretofore provided by law;"

Which was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Lester,

The House went into committee of the Whole for the consideration of the bill.

After a short time spent in committee of the Whole, the committee rose, the Speaker resumed the chair, and the chairman of the committee, Dr. Stubbs, reported that they had had under consideration the bill for the establishment of a uniform system of education in the State of Maryland, had made no progress, and asked to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject.

The report was concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Trail,

The bill was indefinitely postponed.

The Senate bill entitled, "An Act to authorize and empower the commissioners appointed by the Circuit Court of Queen Anne's county, to divide the real estate of John Hendricks, late of said county, deceased, and to convey to the purchaser the legal title to said land;"
