The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The bill entitled, "An Act to compensate Frank H. Stockett, of Anne Arundel county, for the value of a negro slave ;"

Was taken up for consideration on its third reading ;

Mr. Chappell submitted the following amendment :

WHEREAS, It is stated to this General Assembly that a certain Frank H. Stockett, has a claim against the State of Maryland, under the provisions of the 11th section of article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws, and that the Comptroller refuses to pay the said claim, believing that he has no right to do so under the 20th section of Article 3d of the Constitution, until money is appropriated by the Legislature out of which to pay the same ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment, by the Comptroller, of such sum as shall be found to be due, if any, to the said Frank H. Stockett, under the provisions of the said 11th section of article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage ;

Which was adopted.

The bill, as thus amended, was then passed by yeas and nays as follow :
