The bill entitled, "An Act to amend the first section of article 71, of the Public General Laws, relating to oysters;"

Was taken up for consideration on its third reading;

Amend section one by inserting, "that no person or persons shall take or catch oysters on any of the waters of the State, with a scoop or drag, or any other instrument, except as herein provided;"

Which was adopted.
