Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation to introduce a bill to regulate the sale of liquors at places of amusement in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. McCoy, from the committee on Claims, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to refund to Benjamin Fawcett a sum of money, erroneously paid into the Treasury;"
