

The bill entitled, "An Act amendatory of an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and sixty-one and eighteen hundred and sixty-two, chapter one hundred and sixty-eight, entitled, 'an act amendatory of an act passed at January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, chapter two hundred and thirty-five, entitled, an act to lay off and establish a new election district in Dorchester county, to be called district number twelve, or Williamsburg district,'"

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to repeal an act passed at April session of the General Assembly, 1861, chapter 79, which repealed the 41st, 42d, 43d, 46th, 47th, 48th and 112th sections of 63d article of the Code of General Laws entitled, 'Militia,' and the 5th section of the 8th article of the same laws entitled, 'Armories,' and the 741st, 742d and 743d sections of the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws entitled, City of 'Baltimore,' and to re-enact the said sections so repealed ;"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to alter and amend so much of the Public Local Laws of St. Mary's county, article 18, section 35, as relates to the boundary between the 4th and 5th election districts of said county ;"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Trail, from a select committee, reported favorably Senate bill entitled, "An Act to reimburse John A. Steiner, sheriff of Frederick county, a sum of money stolen from his deputy while in the discharge of a public duty by order of the Governor ;"

Which was read the second time.

The joint resolutions relating to the recruiting and enlistment of fugitive slaves from Maryland ;

Was read the second time and rejected by yeas and nays as follow :
