Mr. Jones offered the following amendment:

Ordered, That the thanks of this House be and they are hereby tendered to T. Snowden Thomas, ex-Chief Clerk of the House; Oliver Wood, Sergeant-at-Arms; James R. Donoho, Joal Long, Doorkeepers; Wm. R. Hammond, Postmaster; Caleb Parker and Geo. E. Wolf, Pages; Esma Lowe, Folder; Geo Houck, Lamplighter; John Sullivan, Keeper of the Hall, and that they be paid their per diem for two days, and the usual mileage allowed to members from their respective counties.

Which was adopted.

Messrs. S. L. Duhamel and George Steuart, Committee Clerks, and E. T. Hilton, Postmaster of the House, appeared and were qualified by the Speaker.

The Committee appointed to wait upon the Governor reported that, in connection with a Committee of the Senate, they had performed that duty, and His Excellency would shortly communicate with the House.
