ern Maryland Railroad, and sent to us on yesterday, was by this House referred to the committee on Corporations, and placed in the hands of a member of that committee; that since that time it has disappeared and cannot be found, and though the circumstances of the case have been carefully inquired into by a committee of Investigation, appointed for that purpose, we have been unable to obtain any trace of it. Under these circumstances, we have passed a bill which was upon our files, designed to effect the same purpose, though not identical in terms with the missing bill and herewith transmit the same to you, and venture to express the hope that you may be able to act upon and pass the same in lieu of the bill which has been lost.
