To be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of November next there and there to be condemned according to act of assembly to and for the use of a certain Day Scott and Andrew Scott unless the said John Hendry by him self or his attorney shall appear and answer unto the said Day Scott and Andrew Scott in a plea of his self upon the cause according to law and that by good & lawfull men of your County which you make known unto the person or persons in whose hands you have the same attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justices of Our County Court of Somerset to be held as aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the same goods Cattells lights or credits so attached in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned and Execution thereof and made according to act of assembly in such case made according to act of assembly and provided if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall ^{do} with ~~do~~ that you make known unto our said Justices at the day and place aforesaid and have you them and there this Writ witness Robert King Gentleman Justice of our said Court the 21st day of August in the 20th year of Our dominion &c anno Domini 1735

At Writ signed the third Tuesday of November to wit the Eighteenth day of the same month.

Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and thirty five being the day of the return of the same Writ came the said Day Scott and Andrew Scott by William Goldsbrough his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the same writing writ was directed Likewise came and maketh return hereof to the Court here indorsed in these words following vizt

I certify that by virtue of the within Writ I have on the twenty sixth day of September seventeen hundred and thirty five at Somerset County attached of the goods and chattels of the within named John Hendry one horse of the value of eight hundred pounds of tobacco as appears by the Schedule hereto annexed to have been appraised in due form of Law the appraisers having been qualified before me. Jos. Mifflin Esq: fsc:

September 26: 1735 We Joseph Wales John Stiles, Robert Collier, and Mathias Dashiel being summoned by the Sheriff to appraise the goods and chattels of John Hendry aforesaid on an attachment against his goods for Day and Andrew Scott we do according to the rule in such case doe value the following goods vizt

To a large Black Horse very Old 800: tobacco

Whereupon the said Day Scott and Andrew Scott by their attorney aforesaid prays that upon giving security according to act of assembly in such case made and provided, the aforesaid horse of the value of eight hundred pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid attached may be condemned as the good and chattels of the said John Hendry towards satisfying unto the said Day Scott and Andrew Scott
