And whereupon the same Richard by Thomas Black his attorney saith that Whereas the afo William the twenty Sixth day of November Anno: Dom: Seventeen hundred thirty and four at Yeovil in the County afo. by his certain writing obligatory had Granted himself to be bound unto the afo Richard in the afo Sum of Sixteen thousand four hundred and two pounds of Good merchantable leaf tobacco to be paid unto the said Richard when thereof afterward he should be required Nevertheless the afo William altho' after required the afo Sum of tobacco unto the afo Richard hath not paid, but that unto him he threats to pay altogether refused and still doth refuse to the damage of the said Richard twenty thousand pounds of like tobacco and thereupon he bringeth the Suit &c. and doth bring herinto Court the Writing obligatory afo which the Debth afo in form afo doth testify this Date whereof is the same day and year afo &c.

And the aforesaid William Wye by William Bevingham his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force and Injury when &c. and saith that he cannot gainsay the action afo of the aforesaid Richard Gildart nor but that the writing obligatory aforesaid is the deed of him the same William, nor but that he oweth the same Richard the aforesaid Sixteen thousand four hundred and two pounds of tobacco in manner and form as the aforesaid Richard above against him hath declared &c.

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid Richard Gildart Recover against the aforesaid William Wye his debt aforesaid and his damages by Evasion of the detaining of the same debt to three hundred and thirty three pounds of tobacco to the said Richard of his aforesaid by the Court here adjudged and the aforesaid debts in mercy &c.
