All which day last above mentioned came herein to Court the aforesaid William Jones by his  
attorney aforesaid and the aforesaid John Rider at the same day of the plea being solemnly called  
to witte not nor in his witt Declaration aforesaid further proceeded &c.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid John Rider and his pledges  
of proceeding to witte John Doe and Richard Roe be in duty and that the aforesaid William Jones go  
: there of without day &c. also it is considered that the aforesaid William Jones recover against the  
aforesaid John Rider his damages by reason of the premises to Two hundred

200 pounds of tobacco to the said William at his request for his cost and charges in that part  
Sustained according to the form of the Statute there of lately made and provided by the Court here  
adjudged and the aforesaid William have there of execution &c.
