your petitioner has every old negro about Sixty or Seventy years of age and being  
not able to do little or nothing your petitioner prays your worships that he may be set free  
and your petitioner as no duty bound shall ever pray Ann Mitchell

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation  
thereupon had wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Ann Mitchell  
be discharged from paying of taxes for the aforesaid Negro man for the future as by the petition  
as is prideth

Upon the petition of John Hill and Savannah his wife to this Court setting forth.  
that they are very poor lame and helpless and not capable of Labouring for their living  
and near Seventy or Eighty years <sup>of age</sup>. wherupon it is ordered that a certain James Dashie  
of Somerset County Gentleman find and provide or agree with some person or persons to find  
and provide for the said John Hill and Savannah his wife all such necessaries as may be  
sufficient to support the said John Hill and Savannah his wife in this their poor aged  
Infirm Condition and he to make his report to November Court next the

Moses McColligan an orphan and son of Hugh McColligan <sup>late</sup> of Somerset  
County decd. is by the Court here bound out an apprentice according to act  
of Assembly in such case made and provided unto a certain John Tule of

years he being seven years of age the first day of July next the said Moses McColligan to serve  
his said Master the full term of during which term the said Moses McColligan his said Master well  
and faithfully shall serve his Master keep his commandments lawfully and honestly every where
