Labourer of the said County for breach of the peace upon Noble Tull of the County

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he Should take the said
Abraham Heath if he to answer etc and afterwards to witt the Sixteenth day of March anno Domini One
thousand Seven hundred and Ninety five before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now
here held at Dividing Creek in the same County came the said Abraham Heath in his own proper person
and had a hearing of the presentment afo^d and being instantly demanded how he would acquit
himself of the premises afo^d above upon him Imposed with that of the premises afo^d above
upon him Imposed withal that he is guilty thereof whereupon all and Singular the premises
by the Court here being seen heard and fully understood etc It is considered by the Court here that
the afo^d Abraham Heath pay unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary
for his fine by the Court here upon him Imposed for and by occasion of the trespass and assault
aforesaid whereof inform afo^d he is Condict two shillings and six pence per t^r money of Maryland &
that the said Abraham Heath be taken to Satisfie his said Lordship of his fine afo^d and is discharged
paying off etc

His Lordship ... John Deal and Thomas Blizard came herewith Court in their proper persons and
John Deal & the other pray that their appearance may be leuied and they and their Secundys
Blizard Discharged from a certain recognizance by them & their Secundys before acknowledge
etc Thereupon the said John Deal and Thomas Blizard's appearance are leuied
and they and their Secundys are accordingly discharged

Whereupon the said John Deal and Thomas Blizard are ordered to give recognizance
in Thirty pounds Sterling each for their good behaviour and appearance before the Justices
of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March the
