thousand seven hundred and thirty five before the Justices of his Lordship County Court of Somerset now here held at Widning Creek in and for the same County came the said Jeremiah Liley in his proper person under custody of the Sheriff of Somerset and being by the said Sheriff led to the bar and had hearing of the Indictment aforesaid, and being substantially demanded how he would acquit himself of the felony aforesaid as by the Indictment aforesaid above against him Supposed say that of the felony aforesaid above against him Supposed he is guilty thereof and Every thing in the Indictment aforesaid he freely confesseth etc.

Whereupon all and singular the premises by the Court were seen heard and fully understood .. It seem to the Court here that the aforesaid pair of Boots Red Riding Coat and pair of Stockins are all of the value of four hundred and twenty pounds of tobo  
Thereupon it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Jeremiah Liley pay unto Joseph M'Gester the party deputed four pounds of the value of the goods aforesaid Stolen amounting in the whole to Sixteen hundred and Eighty pounds of tobacco and that the said Jeremiah Liley be whipt at the publick whipping post with fifteen stripes on the bare Back well laid on until the blood appear and that he stand immediately in the pillory one quarter of an hour and that he be taken off and thereupon as to his corporal punishment aforesaid command is given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he do have of immediate Execution according to the Judgment aforesaid Rendered by whipping of the aforesaid Jeremiah Liley at the publick whipping post with fifteen stripes on the bare Back well laid on until the blood appear and by setting him in the pillory one quarter of an hour and after wards in the same Court came the said Sheriff and made returne that he had done the Execution of the Judgment aforesaid as to his corporal punishment aforesaid he was commanded etc - Whereupon it is considered and ordered by the Court here that the Sher. of Somerset County to witt Joseph M'Gester have sold the aforesaid Jeremiah Liley - Immediately to the Biggest bidder not exceeding Seven years toward Satisfying of the four Pounds and the several Officers fees due by reason of the premises aforesaid - afterwards in the same Court came the said Sheriff and made returne to the Court here that he had sold the said Jeremiah Liley unto a certain James Corlett the Biggest Bidder for one thousand pounds of tobacco for Seven years to commence from the day of the date of these presents towards satisfying of the four Pounds and the several Officers fees due by reason of the premises aforesaid
