Lordship his heirs and successors. If it happen that the said Thomas Fletcher do not make his personal  
appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third  
Tuesday of August next and do not answer unto his said Lordship of and concerning what shall be objected  
against him on his said Lordships behalf and do not stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereon and  
do depart the same Court without Leave and in the mean time if he is not of the good Behaviour toward  
his said Lordship and all his good people there - —

aged negro <sup>who by old age</sup> man and a lusture in his grine (or burned) is rendered Incapable of Service whiche  
may appear to your worships more fully by one or more of your worships your petitioners therfore  
humblly praye that your worships will please to consider his agrievance and that as the above menti-  
oned negro is now grown ancient and very ailing by reason of the afo' blement and her liabite paid  
taxes your petitioner praye that your worships would please from this time forth to discharge your peti-  
tioner or the afo' negro from paying of taxes and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation thereupon  
on laid wherefore it is considered that the said William Jones be discharged for the future from paying  
of Taxes for the aforesaid negro man as by the petition aforesaid is prayed
