had wherefore it is ordered by the Court that Mf: William Law and Edward
Rowlands Lay out a road for the said Selby and others that hath occasion of the same to be laid out
from the said Selby's to Snow Hill to be laid out the straightest and best way and of the least of
prejudice to any person or persons whatsoever &c
