At which said Third Tuesday of March to wit the Sixteenth day of the Same month and Year One thousand Seven hundred and thirty five being the day of the return of the same with came the said John Dennis Ind. by Francis Allen his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise Cometh and maketh Return thereof to the Court here Endorsed with honest Invoices short note *Self* of Joseph M^rester Sheriff.

Whereupon the said John Dennis Ind. by his attorney afo^r pray^s that forasmuch as he has Complied with the Law in order to an attachment he may have Judgment against the said John Donelson for his damages afo^r by way of attachment according to act of assembly &c. whereupon for that it seems to the Court here that the said John Dennis has Complied ^{with the Law} as afo^r said.

Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the aforesaid John Dennis Ind. Recover against the aforesaid John Donelson his damages afo^r to the afo^r five thousand three hundred and eighty three ⁹³⁵ pounds of l^o and nine pounds in gold as also all costs and Charges by the said John Dennis laid out and expended by way of attachment against the goods, Chattels Rights and Credit of the said John Donelson according to act of assembly in such case made and provided for.

At Thomas Mitchell } Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take with John Bishop } John Bishop late of Somerset County planter ad. Dick John Bishop Ind. of Somerset County if he should be found in his Bail with and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be hold at Dwidrig Creek the Third Tuesday of March next to answer unto Thomas Mitchell of a plea that he tender unto him eight hundred pounds of good merchantable Lark in hogs that at the least shall way One hundred pounds weight which to him he oweth and unjustly detaineth for and that therof he should not fail for.

And the said Thomas Mitchell by Francis Allen his attorney declared against the aforesaid John Bishop in the plea aforesaid as followeth viz Somerset County s^r John Bishop.
