Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Edmond Jennings doth
reover against the said Jacob Luigo his debt and his damages sustained by occasion
of the detaining of the same debt to one hundred & thirty six pounds
of tobacco to the same Edmond by the Court here of his assent adjudged & the said Jacob
in mercy &c.

in their Bailiwick and him should safekeep so that they might have his
