And forasmuch as it doth appear to the Court here that the said Bowman Townsend hath not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn —

Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Bowman Townsend pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

David Peterkin of Somerset County planter being summoned to appear at this Court to answer his not burning of tobacco according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c. And forasmuch as it doth appear to the Court here that the said David Peterkin hath not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn — Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said David Peterkin pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

Forasmuch as a certain George Paul had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn but being willing to pay his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said George Paul pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

Forasmuch as a certain John Barkley had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn but is willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said John Barkley pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

Forasmuch as a certain Robert Macalpin had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn but is willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Robert Macalpin pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

Forasmuch as a certain William Whaley Junr. had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn but is willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said William Whaley pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —

Thomas Bolin of Somerset County planter being attached by the Sheriff of Somerset County for not appearing at Last November Court held for Somerset County at dividing Road he being legally summoned thereto. Now hereat this day to wit the sixteenth day of March anno Domini 1735 came the said Thomas Bolin in his proper person and being by the Sheriff set to the Oath, but had nothing to object that was material wherefore he had not burnt his tobacco according to Law, but willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Thomas Bolin pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid forty Shillings Court money of Maryland and that he be taken &c. —
