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For as much as fortune ham had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law she was obliged to burn but is willing to pay her fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said fortune ham pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for her fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid Twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland And that she be taken &c.

For as much as aforesaid Thomas Walter had not burnt so much tobacco as by Law he was obliged to burn but was willing to pay his fine for the same &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Thomas Walter pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid Forty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland and that he be taken &c.

Dennis Driskill of Somerset County planter being attached by the Sheriff of Somerset County for not appearing at Last November Court held for Somerset County at dividing Creek he being legally summoned thereto. Now hereat this day to wit the sixteenth day of March and A.D. 1735 came the said Dennis Driskill in his proper person and being by the said Sheriff sett to the Bar but had nothing to object that was material wherefore he had not burnt his tobacco according to Law but is willing to pay his fine for the fact aforesaid. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Dennis Driskill pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland and that he be taken &c.

Philip Carter of Somerset County planter being attached by the Sheriff of Somerset County for not appearing at Last November Court held for Somerset County at dividing Creek he being legally summoned thereto. Now hereat this day to wit the sixteenth day of March and A.D. 1735 came the said Philip Carter in his proper person and being by the said Sheriff sett to the Bar, but had nothing to object that was material wherefore he had not burnt his tobacco according to Law but is willing to pay his fine for the fact aforesaid. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Philip Carter pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid forty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland. And afterwards the same Philip Carter of the same County is by the Court ^{here} acquitted and discharged and ordered to give security for fees but for want thereof he is committed unto the custody of the Sher. of Somerset County thereto remanded. The said Sheriff to wit Jor. Magister Gent. by direct letter his deputy present ^{before} Judge of the said Philip Carter accordingly &c.

John Goldsmith of Somerset County came hereunto Court in his proper person according to aforesaid writ of attachment against him issued for not appearing at November Court last to answer his not burning of tobacco according to act of assembly in such manner and provided, and for as much as the said John Goldsmith had nothing to object that was material wherefore he had not burnt his tobacco according to Law but was willing to pay his fine for the fact aforesaid. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said John Goldsmith pay unto his Lordship for his fine for and by occasion of the premises aforesaid twenty Shillings Curr. money of Maryland and that he be taken &c.
