In consideration of which service the said Randale Smullen present here in Court in his proper person covenants with the Justices of the same Court in manner & form following that is to say that he the said Randale Smullen during the term aforesaid shall and will teach his said apprentice to read well in the Bible and to Knitt woor and Spinn and other housewifery and when his said apprentice shall arrive at the age of fourteen years give her a young Cow of about three years old and at the Expiration of her servitude give her a new suit of Cloathes over and above her Common wearing Cloathes and Likewise provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Cloathing mete for her to have and wear during his term aforesaid. Upon him the said Randale Smullen is ordered by the Court here to give security for to supply with the Covenants aforesaid Thereupon the said Randale Smullen with John Denton of Somerset County planter his security both present here in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto the said Sarah Adams in five pounds Sterling each of their body's goods or Chattells Lands or tenements to the use of the said Sarah Adams ^{to be made and Leased} - If it happen that the said Randale Smullen do not during the term aforesaid teach his said apprentice to read well in the Bible and to Knitt woor and Spinn and other housewifery and do not give unto his said apprentice when she shall arrive at the age of fourteen years a young Cow of about three years old and at the Expiration of her servitude do not give her a new suit of Cloathes over and above her Common wearing Cloathes and do not provide for his said apprentice during the term aforesaid meat drink washing Lodging and Cloathing mete for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesaid
