 Jeremiah Lilley } that now is for the body of Somerset County a<sup>d</sup> upon their oaths do present that  
 day of may Anno Domini seventeen hundred thirty and six with force and arms at the parish a<sup>d</sup> in the  
 County a<sup>d</sup> within the Jurisdiction of this Court two white Linen shirts of the value of fifteen shillings  
 current money of Maryland each, and one Linen waistcoat of the value of five shillings like money  
 of the goods and Chattles of William Turpin then and there being found then and there feloniously  
 did steal take and bear away contrary to the peace of the said Lord proprietary his good rule and  
 Government and against the form of the act of assembly in such case lately made and provided &c.  
 Test William Turpin Alexander Fullerton. — On the backside of the frequent Bill of Indictment it was that  
 Edward Bid — Samuel Wilson. freeman.

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said Jeremi-  
 ah Lilley a<sup>d</sup> to answer &c. and afterwards to with the fifteenth day of June Anno Domini one thousand seven  
 hundred and thirty six before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now here holden at divid-  
 ing Court in the same County came the said Jeremiah Lilley in his proper person under Custody of the Sheriff  
 of Somerset County into whose Custody before that time was committed for the Cause a<sup>d</sup> being by the said  
 Sheriff led to the Bar is thereupon instantly demanded how he would acquit himself of the felony a<sup>d</sup> as  
 by the Indictment a<sup>d</sup> is above against him Imposed who thereupon says that he is not guilty thereof  
 and of this he puts himself upon the Country and William Goldbrough Gent who for his said Lordship in  
 that part followeth the Verdict &c. — Thereupon it is Commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that immedi-  
 ately he should cause to come <sup>here</sup> before the Justices a<sup>d</sup> twelve &c. and who neither &c. to Recognize &c. because as  
 well &c. and afterwards immediately came there of the Jury &c. and the Jurors of that same Jury by Joseph  
 Maister Gent Sheriff of the County a<sup>d</sup> to this Impannelled being called came to with Robert Jones Joseph  
 Wailer James Acam Quirk John Nutter Angells althowon William Porter Thomas Seal, Thomas  
 Winder Jonathan Sturges John Reddish Charles Townsend and John Prock who to say the truth of  
 the premises a<sup>d</sup> being duly Sworn upon their Oaths do say that the said Jeremi-  
 ah Lilley is guilty of the felony a<sup>d</sup> as by the Indictment a<sup>d</sup> above upon him Imposed in manner &c.  
 form above supposed — Whereupon All and Singular the premises by the Court here seen heard  
 and fully understood — Thereupon the Court here according to act of assembly in such case made and provided  
 valued the two shirts & waistcoat <sup>in the Indictment a<sup>d</sup> mentioned</sup> to seventeen shillings and six pence current money of Maryland —

Thereupon it is provided by the Justices here that the said Jeremiah Lilley pay unto the a<sup>d</sup> Wm  
 Turpin the party a<sup>d</sup> deprived him self of the value of the a<sup>d</sup> two shirts and one white waistcoat in the  
 Indictment
