lon Lord Barons of Baltimore &c To the Sheriff of Somerset County Greeting we command you that you attach the goods Chattels rights or Creditts of Thomas Gray late of Somerset County Merchant if they -
shall be found in your bailewick to the value of three pounds fifteen shillings Sterling and -
four hundred pounds of tobacco and when you have the same attached or any part thereof the same
in your custody safe keep so that you have the same before our Justices of our County Court of
Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June next there and there to be
condemned according to act of assembly to and for the use of a certain Samuel Wilson unless
the said Thomas Gray by himself or his attorney shall appear and answer unto the said
