Samuel Wilson of a plea of trespass upon the case according to Law and that by good and Law: full men of your bedly which you make known unto the person or persons in whose hands you make the same attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justices of our County Court to be held as aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the same goods - Chattels rights or Credits so attached in his hers or their hands ought not to be forborne and Execution there of had and made according to act of assembly (in such case made and provided) if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall Execute this writ that you make known unto our said Justices at the day and place aforesaid and have you there and there this writ witness John Smith ^{Justice} one of our Justices of our said Court the twentieth day of march Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty six

At which said third Tuesday of June (to wit) the fifteenth day of the same month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty six came the said Samuel Wilson by Geo. Douglas his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise Kenneth Quabath Valuer thereof to the Court here Endorsed in these words following to wit. I herby certify that on the Eleventh of June I attached in Somerset County of the goods and Chattels of Thomas Gray to the Value of four pounds twelve shillings as by a Schedule hereunto annexed may appear and those goods and Chattels in due form of Law did come to be appraised and for the use of Samuel Wilson within mentioned so answers Jos: M. Carter for
