and Execution there of had and made according to act of assembly (in such case made and
provided) if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall execute this writ
that you make known unto our said Justices at the day and place apd and have you then
and there this Writ witness John Smith, one of our Justices of our said Court the twentieth
day of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty five

At which said third Tuesday of June (to wit) the fifteenth day of this same month and year one thousand
seven hundred and thirty five came the said Samuel Wilson by Geo. Douglas his attorney and
the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise came Elizabeth Calver
Vicere of the Court here endorsed in these words following viz I hereby certify that on the Eleventh
of June I attached in somerset County of the goods and Chattels of Thomas Gray to the value of four
pounds twelve shillings as by a Schedule hereunto annexed may appear and those goods and Chattels
in due form of Law did cause to be appraised and for the use of Samuel Wilson within mentioned
so answers Jno: M'Graw Esq

A Schedule of the goods of Thomas Gray attached for Cap^t Samuel Wilson and appraised as follows.

To 1 Cow	1 lb 2 oz
To 1 young year old heifer	on 12 oz

To 2 Sows & four pigs	0..12..6

apd -- Thereupon afterani George Gale of Somerset County Gentleman present herein Court in his proper

or any part of the said Samuel Wilsons claim against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to have
