Ihereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the aforesaid -
Winifred Abden if she should be found in his baileywark if &c to answer &c and afterward to witness the same
evening day of June anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and fifty five before the Justices of this Lordship -
County Court of Somerset now here held at Bridgwater in the same County came the said Winifred Abden
in her proper person according to a certain Recognizance by her and her security in that part first aforesaid
deposed and had a hearing of the Indictment aforesaid and being instantly demanded how she would acquit
herself of the premises aforesaid above by the Indictment upon her imposed, said that of the premises
aforesaid above upon her imposed she is guilty thereof and is willing to pay her fine for the fact aforesaid
Whereupon all and Singular the premises by the Court here seen heard and fully understood and mature
deliberation thereupon had It is therefore considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid Winifred Abden
pay unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary for her fine by the Court hereupon her imposed for
and by Creation of the premises aforesaid whereof in sum aforesaid she is bound yearly shillings current
money for the use of this County aforesaid and that the said Winifred Abden be taken to satisfy his Lordship
Lord High of the Exchequer fine aforesaid Whereupon the said Winifred Abden is ordered to give security
for the payment of the several Officers fees due by Creation of the premises aforesaid upon the Indictment
aforesaid Thereupon a certain George Bowens of Somerset County Bricklayer & inhabitant in his
proper person acknowledged himself indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of five pounds
Sterling of his body goods or Chattels Lands or tenements to be made over to the use of the Officers
of Somerset County Court that he hath any right to any fees upon the Indictment aforesaid &c
If it happeneth that the said George Bowens do not pay and satisfy unto the several Officers their
fees due by Creation of the premises aforesaid upon the Indictment aforesaid

His Lordship John White of Locomore in Somerset County planter appears here in Court
John White po: according his recognizance before entered into, whereupon the said John White appears
is remanded and he accordingly discharged therefrom, whereupon the said John White
is ordered by the Court here to give new recognizance for his appearance at August Court next to answer
unto his Lordship of and concerning a certain Information against him exhibited for Exchequer Duty &c
Thereupon the said John White present herein in his proper person acknowledged himself
indebted
