

William Hayman aged Sixty nine years sworn as aff and saith that he carried the Chain after Sonthy Whittington Surveyor and when they came to the End of the Number of Perches which was at a stooping Gum and the Surveyor said the Number of perches was out and they Lookt in the Branch for a marked Gum but found none as he remembors as above. second Choue and further saith not. —

Alexander Adams aged fifty six years sworn as aff saith that some years since he was with the Surveyor running the second Line of second Choue and on an Island or place of Land surrounded with Branches the word was given that the number of Perches was out and several people went to Look if they could find a marked Gum and they found a gum down but so far rotten they could not find any marks One Charles Mullen was present and said he had seen a marked Gum formerly that Lookt like a binder tree this deponent asked the said Mullen whether he ever was told that the tree he saw was a binder of the Land called second Choue who said they did not the said Mullen said that he lived sometime before that on the plantation where Mr Gillis now live and further this deponent saith not. —

Matthew Dorman aged fifty Seven years being sworn as aff saith that some years agoe he was running out some Land called second Choue and when they Run the second Line to the End of the number of perches he called out the Surveyor told that he could goe use further it was in a branch and went to Look for a marked Gum and they saw a gum looked at the top but could not see any marks on it. Charles Mullen said that he had seen a marked tree near that place Mr Gillis said he had an Order to Run out his plantations and he would Run them this deponent saith that he remembors that when Charles Mullen lived where Mr Gillis now live and further saith not. —

Sonthy Whittington aged forty nine years sworn as aff saith that he knows nothing of the boundaries of second Choue Bear quarter of good Luck nor where they stood & further saith not. —

William Whittington aged fifty two years sworn as aff saith that he knows nothing of the boundaries of second Choue Bear quarter or good Luck nor where they stood and further saith not. —

Alexander Adams aged fifty six years being sworn as aff saith that the first Boundary of second Choue and Bear quarter was a white Oade where now a cedar post stands a distance from Mr Gillis's Coal ground Easterly as Mr Raymond told him he cut down the tree about his mile which was the occasion of setting up the post and further saith not. —
