Upon this the said Elisha is ordered to give security for the payment of the severall Officers their fees due by reason of the promises on the Indictment and recognizance aforesaid. Thereupon Johnson Hill of Somerset County planter present here in Court in his proper person undertook for the said Elisha Hill and acknowledge himself indebted in five pound Sterling to be levied. If it happen that the said Johnson Hill do not pay unto the severall Officers their fees due as is upon the premises aforesaid &c.
