Somerset County planters in their proper persons and acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honble the Lord Proprietary that is to say the said Saul Townsend in Twenty pounds Sterling and the said Joshua Caldwell and Benjamin Langford in ten pounds Sterling each of their goods and Chattels Land and Tenements of every of them severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen that the said Saul Townsend do not make his personall appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be hold at dividing Creek in the County the third Tuesday of November next to answer unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of and concerning a certain trespass and assault by him committed and done on certain James Houlston and do not stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereon and do depart the same Court without leave and in the mean time if he is not of the good behaviour towards his said Lordship and all other his good people and more especially towards the said James Houlston &c

Likewise the said James Houlston present herein Court is ordered to give recognizance for his appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be hold at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November next to give evidence and prosecute the said Saul Townsend for an assault &c

Thereupon the said James Houlston present herein Court in his proper person and acknowledged himself indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in ten pounds Sterling good and lawful money of England to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen that the said James Houlston do not make his personall appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be hold at dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of November next and do not then and there give such Evidence as he knows or believes of his Lordship against Saul Townsend and do depart the same Court without leave &c

Ordered that Thomas Williams put out and agree with some one person or persons to take care of certain Ais Bames a poor Object that not capable of taking care of her self, to keep find and provide for the said Ais Bames all such necessary as may be sufficient for her support until November Court next in this her poor weak condition and health or they so finding and knowing of the same Ais Bames with necessary as for her support to be allowed for the same next Levy Court &c

It appearing to the Court here by the motion of Lewis Gale Esq. that the two sons of the late Charles of Somerset County Gent. deceased under the care of Cap. John Maulester their Guardian appointed is likely to inherit a considerable Estate in Scotland &c. Whereupon it is ruled by the Court here that the said John Maulester Guardian as aforesaid have the Liberty of sending the said Children to Scotland to their Relation there in order to inherit the Estate aforesaid and notwithstanding one of the Justices later his dissent thereto but is willing that the Children be removed to any other person but not to go to Scotland &c
