to do so all which said third Tuesday of June to wit the fifteenth day of the same month and doth one thousand
Seven hundred and thirty six being the day of the Return of the said Writ came the said William Draper by Robert
Jenckins Henry his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit Joseph Mester Gents at the same day
returned that the same John Riley is not found &c. Thereupon Command is again given to the Sheriff
of Somerset County that he should take the said John Riley if he should be found in his bailiwick and him safe
keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court to be held at dividing Creek in the same County the third Tues-
day of August then next to answer unto the aforesaid William Draper of the aforesaid Plea and that he should
not fail to do so all which said third Tuesday of August to wit the seventh day of the same
month and doth one thousand Seven hundred and thirty six being the day of the Return of the same
Writ came the said William Draper by his attorney aforesaid and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit Joseph
Mester Gents at the same day returned that the aforesaid John Riley is not found &c.

Thereupon the said William Draper by his attorney aforesaid Complaines against the said John Riley in the plea
as followeth vizt. Somerset County ss. John Riley late of Somerset County planter was
attached to answer unto William Draper of a plea of trespass upon the case &c.
And whereupon the same William by Robert Jenckins, Henry his attorney complains
that whereas the aforesaid John after the first day of May Anno Domini seventeen hundred and five (to wit)
the seventh day of June one thousand seven hundred thirty and five at Somerset County within
the Jurisdiction of this Court made his certain note in writing commonly called a Promissory
note in his own proper hand thereunto subscribed bearing date the same day and year last
(mentioned)
