near Cottingshams Creek Wee therefore require you or any three or two of you at sometime and place as to you or any three or two of you shall seem convenient you meet on those lands called Sot^t (you first having taken your oaths on the holy Evangelist of almighty God according to act of assembly in such case made and approved) and there cause to come before you or any three or two of you all such evidences as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated by the said compleaintant or else if any and that you or any three or two of you examine them upon their corporall oaths to be by you or any three or two of you administered on the holy Evangelist of almighty God in the presence of the compleaintant or else if any touching the truth or remembrance of their knowledge or anything that may relate to the cause aforesaid reducing the several depositions into writing you and the same together with this our commission under your or any three or two of your hands and seals to us to our County court of Somerset with all convenient speed, Witnes Robt King gent Chief Justice of our said court the seventeenth day of June in the twenty second year of our dominion &c Anno Domⁱ one thousand seven hundred and thirty six

Now herewith this day to wit the Seventeenth day of August anno Domⁱ One thousand Seven hundred & Ninety Six have come unto Court the severall Commissioners mentioned in the aforesaid Commission and made returne whereof is endorsed as followeth with the severall depositions thereto annexed - August the 1st. 1736 Then the within Leunihale Edward Chamber Thomas Gillis and Mathias Hale Qualifiid themselves to execute the within Commission by taking the oaths by the act of assembly in that case made and provided before the subscriber one of the Justices of the Peace for Somerset County - Geo Darke

Somerset County J^r. Depositions of Witnesses taken the fourteenth of August seventeen hundred and thirty Six upon a tract of land called Sot^t lying on the north side of Rockawaken River in Somerset County aforesaid by value of a Commission out of Somerset County Court due notice being given aforesaid

Alexander Adams Rector of Stegney parish aged about fifty six years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God at request of Mr John Handy deposeth saith that he last Spring was twelve months old Richard Hillson late of Somerset County dec^d showed the deponent a burnt stump which the deponent verily believeth to be a sumpp where the deponent was this day sworn by the Commissioners appointed to examine witnesses in relation to the bound^t of tract of land called Sot^t and where the said Commissioners caused an umberly post marked with sixteen Nolkes to be set up which is about thirty three yards from a post in a fork of two branches a little above in respect to Rockawaken river a place called Thomas Humphrys Cellar and about five yards from a Pine marked with four Nolkes on three sides which stands on the edge of the western side of the
