Kilchen present here in Court in his proper person <sup>and upon his behalf</sup> that if in case the said William Langfitt should recover Judgment in the plea oft against the said William Kilchen or that the said William Kilchen should be therem convicted that then he the said William Kilchen should pay the Judgment of the Court there on or Render his Body in execution of such Judgment to the prison of the Sheriff of Somerset County in Satisfaction where for that he the said Peter Taylor will do the same for him &c.

And the same William Kilchen by Francis Allen his attorney cometh defendant before  
and Injuring wheat & and pray <sup>or hereto</sup> to Imparte hereunto next Court and he will it and the same  
day is given to the afo William Langfitt here also &c.

At which said next Court to wit the seventeenth day of August anno Domini One thousand  
and seven hundred and thirty six came againe as well the afo William Langfitt as the  
afo William Kilchen by their attorneyes & and where uppon the same William Langfitt  
prays that the afo William Kilchen to his delation afo may answer, and the same Wm  
Kilchen altho at the same day solemnly called cometh not, nor says nothing in Barre or pre  
clusion of the action afo of the afo William Langfitt by which the same William Langfitt  
remains against the same William Kilchen there of undespised.

for that the same William Langfitt his damages afo against the afo William Kilchen by  
Causation of the non performance of the promise and assumption afo ought to recover but  
because it is not knowne to his Lordships County Court of Somerset here what damages  
the afo William Langfitt by quantum afo in that sustained therefore it is commanded  
the Sheriff of Somerset County that by the Oath of Recurst and Surety <sup>men</sup> of his baillie with  
that he diligently inquire what damages the afo William Langfitt hath sustained by Causation  
of the non performance of the promise and assumption afo beyond his cost and charges by  
him about his suit in that part apposed and the Inquisition which therupon he shal  
take to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Doding Creek  
the third Tuesday of November next under his Seal and his seals of those by whose Oath he  
makes the same Inquisition he send together with the writs thereof to him directed and the same  
day is given to the afo William Langfitt here &c.
