the sum of five pounds curr. money of Maryland of their goods and Chattels Lands and
tenements joyntly and severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his
Pais and Successors If it happen that the said Abraham Cutten do stand unable to pay unto his
said Lordship fifty Shillings curr. money of Maryland for every year he shall keep such ordi-
nary or house of Entertainment &c

Likewise the said Abraham Cutten with James Martin and John Scarbrough his security aforesaid
all present herein Court in their proper persons aforesaid acknowledge themselves indebted unto his
Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of forty pounds curr. money of Maryland of their goods and
Chattels Lands and tenements joyntly and severally to the use of his said Lordship his Pais and Successors
to be made and levied If it happen that the said Abraham Cutten do not keep good rules and orders
and do suffer idle loose or disorderly persons to Tipple game or commit disorders or irregulari-
ties in his ordinary or house of entertainment during the time that he shall keep the same contrary
to the true intent and meaning of the act of assembly in such case made and provided &c
