Whereupon ~~John~~ William Teague of Somerset County planter present here in his proper person came to court for the said William Teague and acknowledged himself indebted unto the Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England of his goods and chattels lands and tenements to be made and levied to the use of his Lordship his heirs & Successors If it happens that the aforesaid William Teague do not make his personal appearance before the Justices of the next assize nisi prius byer and terminer and good delivery to be held at Annapolis Creek the first Tuesday of September next and do not then and there give such evidence as he shall know against John Calman of and concerning his feloniously stealing One pocket Book and three pounds one shilling and six pence in bills of credit of and from a certain John Reddish and do depart the same Court without leave to him.

fully by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 17th day of June
Anno Domⁱ 1735

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the Comptny
General hath transmitted unto this Court the account of the Estate of Richard
Samuels dec'd whereon it is found that there is balance due to the above named aforesaid
orphans the sum of thirty three pounds fourteen Shillings & five pence &
half penny currant money if therefore the above named Ann Samuels her
heir Ex^r or Adm^r shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto
the above named Richard Samuels & Martha Samuels orphans as a^t their
a^t sum of thirty three pounds fourteen Shillings & five pence half penny to
be paid them according to the dec'd Will and the act of Assembly in such case
provided when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same then
the above obligation to be void and of none effect otherwise to stand and
remain in full force and virtue in Law.
