Att which said next Court to witt the sixteenth day of November Aund: Done one thousand seven hundred and thirty six came againe aswell the afe Thomas Fletcher as the afe Abraham Mannering by their attorney's afe and whereupon the same Abraham as before defends the force and injury when he says he is not guilty of the promises above upon him, imposed in manner and form as the said Thomas above against him hath complained and of this he puts himself on the Country and the afe Thomas in like Manner

Thereupon it is Comanded the sheriff of Somerset County that Immediately he should Cause to Come here before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now sitting at Dividing Creek in the same County twelve J<sup>rs</sup> by whom J<sup>r</sup> and who neither J<sup>r</sup> to Recognize J<sup>r</sup> because aswell J<sup>r</sup> and afterwards Immediately came thereof the Jury J<sup>r</sup> and the Jurors, of that same Jury by Joseph M<sup>r</sup> Chester Gent. sheriff of the County afe to this, Impanelled being: Elected came, to witt David Bolk Robert Mitchell Benjamin Tull Thomas Winder John Perkins James Houston John Roach William Kitchen William Porter Huet Nutter William Gray Robert Hall who to say the truth of the premises afe being duly Elected bys, and Sworn upon their Oath sayd that the afe Abraham Mannering is guilty of the promise above upon him imposed in manner and form as the said Thomas above against him hath complained and afe the damages of the same Thomas by occasion of the premises afe beyond his costs and charges by him about his Suit in that part assessed to ten Shillings Court money of Maryland and for those costs and charges to one pound of Tobacco.

Therefore it is Considered that the afe Thomas Fletcher recover against the afe Abraham Mannering his damages afe by the Jurors afe in fore afe afe also one hundred and Twenty one pound of Tobacco for his costs and charges afe to the same Thomas by the Court here of his afe of Increase adjudged which Court damages in the whole do amount to ten Shillings Court money of Maryland and one hundred and Twenty two pounds of Tobacco and the afe Abraham in Merit
