cainest or deft if any touching the truth or Remembrance of their knowledge or any thing that may
relate to the Cause aforesaid, that reducing the severall depositions into writing you send the same togeth-
er with this our Commission under your own three or two of your hands and seals to us to our County
Court of Somerset with all convenient speed Witness Robert King Esq. Chief Justice of our
said Court the twentieth day of Aug^r in the twenty second year of our said Dominion H^c and J^m
one thousand seven hundred and thirty six.

On the aforesaid Commission it was ordered viz September 25. 1736 Came the within Geo:
Dashield and Thomas Gillis before us the Subscribers one of his Majesty's Justices of the peace
for Somerset County and made oath upon the holy Evangelist of almighty God to execute the within
Commission according to an act of assembly in that case made and provided. John Handy.

This Commission granted as appears by the deposition to this amount of 25th Sept. 1736.
Somerset Co. Deposition of Witnesses taken on the land called Tomps vineyard, behalf
of M^r. Alexander Adams by virtue of a Commission to us directed from Somerset County Court
dated the 20th day of Aug^r Anno Domini 1736 is as follows.

Peter Suman aged about sixty four years or there about being sworn on the holy Evangelist
of almighty God saith that a pine sherd now stands a pear stalk which proved to be the first
found of the vine chance by Edward Roman was the boulder of the land that did belong to the
negress or was the division tree and that Steven, Honey allowed the same tree to divide him
and Alex^r. Mitchell and he heard John Casadew say that he marked the same tree to en-
saw it marked and he heard Alex^r. Mitchell and Geo^r. Godart acknowledge the same tree to be
the boulder. He further saith that he apprehends the land where the negress was called
