Now heretofore this day to wit the seventeenth day of June and Dom. One thousand seven hundred and
thirty five be fore the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now holden at Dunsing Beck
Coma the Capelle King Thomas Denwood and John Finch three of the Gents mentioned in the aforesaid
Commission did make return thereto the said Com with the following Depositions the same amount
vizt. Somerset County July the 10th 1735

The Deposition of Thomas Carey aged about thirty years or thereby being
sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God saith that about fourteen
years ago he was ordered by his father to go with him to his Uncle Richard
Carey and when this deponant came there he went from thence with his
father his Uncle and severall of the Neighbours to a dead red oak then
standing whose top was then broke down, and the said oak stood easterly
about one hundred and twenty yards from a house where Richard M. Gray
then did live; and that they there then did mark a young standing
pine which stood near unto the said old red oak; which was marked for
a second boulder of a tract of Land called Owens Improvement and was
then allowed of by all their present to be the second boulder of the said
tract; and that this deponant further saith that there stood a sassafras
on the other side of the old red oak which they then marked according
as they did the said pine and further saith not Thomas Carey
