Tuesday of August and Term One thousand seven hundred and thirty six being the day of the Return of the said Writ came the said John Shiles by Thomas Blunt his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit Joseph M<sup>r</sup>ester Gent Likewise came and made return that by Vertue of the writ afo<sup>r</sup> to him there of directed he had taken the body of the said William Borman whose body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at the same day and place in the writ afo<sup>r</sup> mentioned he had there ready &c

And the afo<sup>r</sup> William Borman by Francis Allen his attorney comes and defends the fine and Injury when &c and prays Leave thereof to discharge here until next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo<sup>r</sup> John Shiles also &c

All which said next Court to wit the sixteenth day of November and Term One thousand seven hundred and thirty six came againe as well the afo<sup>r</sup> John Shiles as the afo<sup>r</sup> William Borman by their attorneys afo<sup>r</sup> and because the afo<sup>r</sup> John Shiles did not declare against the afo<sup>r</sup> William Borman by the Twentieth day of January then next following nor prosecutes his writ afo<sup>r</sup>.

Therefore he and his pledges of prosecuting being mercy and the self name pledges &c and that the afo<sup>r</sup> William Borman goe thereof without Day also it is considered that the afo<sup>r</sup> William Borman Recover against the afo<sup>r</sup> Thomas Shiles his damage by Ouasion of the premises to One hundred and Sixty One

161 pounds of Tobacco to the said William Borman by discretion of the Justices here at his Request for his Costs and Charges in that part sustained according to the form of the Statute in such Case lately made and provided by the Court here as judged &c

To wit John Shiles did: } Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County

Thomas Covington. } that he should take Thomas Covington Late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should safely keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Tree in the same County the third Tuesday of August then next to answer unto John Shiles Sen<sup>r</sup> of plea of trespass upon the Case &c and that thereof he should not fail &c
