Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should &c. a. every Morgan take Avery Morgan Late of Somerset County planter otherwise called Avery Morgan if he should be found in his body with him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Doding Creek in his same County the third Tuesday of August then next to answer unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary of a place that he tender unto him Twenty pounds sterling which unto the said Lord Proprietary he oweth & injuriously detainted and that thereof he should not fail &c. At which said third Tuesday of August to wit the Seventeenth day of the same month anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and Thirtysix being the day of the return of the said Writ came the said Lord Proprietary by William Gold, barrister his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit Joseph Maggs Esq: to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise cometh and made return that by virtue of the writ aff'd to him there directed he had taken the body of the said Avery Morgan whose body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at the same day and place where the writ aforesaid was had there ready &c. Whereupon came here unto Court Thomas Brodin and Daniel Lee of Somerset County planters and undertook and each of them undertook and assumed upon themselves for the same Avery Morgan Likewise the said Avery Morgan present herein Court in his proper person (swore) upon himself that if it should happen that the said Lord Proprietary should recover judgment in the place aforesaid against him the said Avery Morgan in his same Court or that the said Avery Morgan should be therein convicted that then he the said Avery Morgan should pay to the said Lord Proprietary unto the said Lord Proprietary or tender his body in execution of such judgment to the prison of the Sheriff of Somerset County in satisfaction thereof or that they the said Thomas Brodin & Daniel Lee would do the same for him &c.

Indigo Kerell Avery Morgan by George Douglas his attorney comes and defends the fine and injury whereof he prays leave hereof to Impark hereunder next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to his said Lordship also &c.

At which said next Court to wit the Sixteenth day of November anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and thirty Six came again as well the said Lord Proprietary by his attorney as the said Avery Morgan by his attorney also and whereupon his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary by his attorney doth protest himself herein Court that he will no further prosecute agt: the said Avery Morgan in the place aforesaid. Whereas the same Avery Morgan goes the day of without day &c.
