And altho the said William five pounds parcell of the aforesaid Eleven pounds nineteen Shillings and nine pence half penny to the said Robert he hath paid and satisfied yett as to Six pounds nineteen shillings and nine pence half penny the said William his promise and assumption aforesaid made nothing regarding but plotting and fraudulently Intending the said Robert in that part least likely and Subtilty to deceive and defraud the said Six pounds nineteen Shillings
