If it happen that the said Joshua Merrie, John Townend and Solomon Townend and each and every of them do and shall not make their personal appearance before the Justices of his Lordship County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court house at Dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of June then next and do not then & there give such Evidence as they and each of them doe know ag<sup>t</sup> they said Cornelius and Charles Dickerson and each of them on behalf of his Lordship of and concerning their the said Cornelius and Charles committing of an assault on him the said Joshua Merrie, and doe deport the same Court without leave -

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he  
Should take the said William Conner if he should be found in his County and have should satisfye to that  
he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court house at  
Dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of March then next to answer unto his said Lordship  
of and concerning his Judgment afo<sup>r</sup> for de <sup>above upon demand</sup> his committing of the assault afo<sup>r</sup> and that there of he  
should not fail for - And afterwards for with the third Tuesday of March being the fifteenth day of  
the same Month and Anno One thousand Seven hundred and thirty six before the Justices of his said Lord-  
ships County Court of Somerset now here held in the Court house at Dividing Creek in the County afo<sup>r</sup> came the said  
William Conner in his proper person and had hearing of his Judgment afo<sup>r</sup> and being instantly  
demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises afo<sup>r</sup> saide that he will not contend with his said Lord-  
ship the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> but submits with a grovelling of his innocency and putteth himself upon the favour  
of
