The same - Somerset County sh^{rs} The Justices for the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is for the County of Somerset County aforesaid upon their oath do present that William Conner late of County parish in the County aforesaid planter the seventeenth day of October Anno Domini seventeen hundred thirty and six at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon a certain Elizth Marchant wife of Benjth Marchant of the same County planter in the peace of God and of the said Lord Proprietary then and there being with force and Arms an assault did make and the same Elizth then and there did beat wound and evilly treat so that often life it was much despaired and other harms to her then and there did to the great damage of the same Elizth and against the peace of the said Lord Proprietary that now is his good Rule and Government &c. On the foregoing bill of Indictment it was Endorsed viz True Bill p^{ro} Wm Jones foreman

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said William Conner if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held in the Court House at dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of March then next to answer unto his said Lordship of and concerning the Indictment aforesaid for trespass and assault &c. and that if he should not fulfil

All which said Third Tuesday of March to wit the fifteenth day of the same month Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and thirty Six before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now holden in the Court House at dividing Creek in the same County came the said William Conner in his proper person and had hearing of the Indictment aforesaid and being instantly demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises aforesaid as by the Indictment aforesaid above upon him imposed with that he will not contend with his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary but submit with agreement of his Innocency and put himself upon the favour of the Court. whereupon all and singular the premises by the Court here seen heard and fully understood.
