Ramsey and assumed upon themselves (likewise the said Charles Ramsey assumed upon himself) that if in case the said Robert McFarlane should recover Judgement in the pleas against the said Charles Ramsey or that the said Charles Ramsey should be thereupon convicted that then he the said Charles Ramsey should pay the Condemnation of the Court thereupon or render his body in execution of such Judg^t to the prison of the Sher^r of Somerset County in satisfaction thereof that he the said John Ramsey will do the same for him.

Whereupon the said Charles Ramsey by George Douglas his attorney general and defendant before and injury wherein he and prays that the aforesaid Robert McFarlane may give security for costs according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided in case that he nonsuit in the plea of or otherways Legally cast which is by His Court granted &c whereupon the aforesaid Robert McFarlane being solemnly called comitteth not nor is he well aforesaid against the said Charles Ramsey further presented &c

Therefore he and his pledges of prosecuting be in mercy and let the p^t name pledges & and that the aforesaid Charles Ramsey go thence without day also it is considered that the aforesaid Charles Reiver against the aforesaid Robert his damages by occasion of the premises to Two hundred and eighteen

196 pounds of tobacco to the same Charles by direction of the Justices here at his request for his costs and charges in that part sustained according to the form of the Statute &c by the Court here adjudged &c

Ordered was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take John Britt late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his baileywicks and him should waife keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Maj^s County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next to answer to Ralph Corbin of a plea of trespass upon the case &c And that thereof he should not fail &c

And the aforesaid Ralph Corbin by George Douglas his attorney complained against the aforesaid John Britt in the place aforesaid as follows &c

In that the aforesaid John Britt late of Somerset County planter was demanded to answer unto Ralph Corbin of a plea of trespass upon the case &c

And whereupon the said Ralph by George Douglas his attorney came & pleading that he had the aforesaid John Britt after the first day of January last named done a sum of money being one hundred and fifteen to witness the fourteenth day of February
