Command was given to the sheriff of Somerset County that he should
take Robert Dias late of Somerset County in the province of Maryland prisoner
or otherwise called Robert Dias of Dorchester County in the province aforesaid if he should
be found in his Bailwick and him should safekeep so that he might have his body before the
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday
of June next to satisfy a certain John Zenan as well a certain debt of four pounds
seven shillings which the same John Zenan in the same Court before the Justices thereof at
dividing Creek in the County of Annapolis recovered against him as of three hundred and eight pounds
of tobacco which to the same John Zenan in the same Court were adjudged for his damages
suffered by occasion of the detention of that same debt value of his said Court
