On the backside of the foregoing Bill of Judgment it was thus Endorsed by a Person

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of
Somerset County that he should take the said Elizabeth Harman if &c. to answer the same and afterwards to
to wit the nineteenth day of August anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and thirty five before the
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now here held at dividing Creek in the same County
came the said Eli^o Harman in her proper person and had a hearing of the Judgment afo^rd and being
instantly demanded how she would acquit herself of the premises afo^rd as by the Judgment afo^rd
above upon her it is imposed says that she is guilty thereof

Whereupon all and Singular the premises by the Court were seen heard and fully understood it
seems to the Court here that the afo^rd Eli^o Harman is a black woman and does not come within the
intent of the act of Assembly to punish such persons being guilty of Fornication &c.

Whereupon it is considered by the Justices here that the afo^rd Eli^o Harman be held of —
quiet and go without day &c. Likewise it is considered that the afo^rd Eli^o Harman give security for
to pay all the Officers fees due by reason of the premises afo^rd upon the Judgment afo^rd Whereupon
William Lane of Somerset County Gentleman present here in Court undertook for the said Eli^o Harman
to pay the several Officers fees due as afo^rd upon the Judgment afo^rd
